#### 2023 - What A Year!

In 2020, the Swallow Charitable Foundation provided the **Colorado Soccer Foundation (CSF)** with the funding to build and operate a world-class facility called **Soccer City Aurora (SCA)**. Since opening in June of 2021, SCA has had 89,850 users (81% youth)!

Youth sports participation is declining, and many families, especially those in low-income communities, can't afford to participate. The average age when kids drop out of sports is 11, and younger still for girls and families struggling financially. The Colorado Soccer Foundation's mission is to make the game of soccer accessible to kids who want to play.

Our 2023 Annual Report explains how we are making soccer accessible through after school soccer leagues, youth skills training, tournaments, referee training, and pick up play. We are able to offer low-cost, high-quality programs through generous gifts from foundations, corporations, and individuals, as well as from a new partnership with the City of Aurora. Thank you to all our partners who have made soccer accessible to thousands of kids every year. As we continue our mission at Soccer City Aurora, we are actively exploring opportunities to build additional facilities in other parts of Colorado. Join us and let's get kids on the field!



## Pick Up Play

- A safe and accessible place to play we supply pennies and a timer - no referees, coaches or parents necessary
- Three-month youth memberships for \$10
- 40,718 check-ins during 2023 (81% youth)

An average of 141 players a day at Soccer City



#### Soccer After School

- 1,200 youth from 25 Denver Metro area partner schools with an average of 92% Free and Reduced Lunch rate
- 75% of players have never played an organized sport
- Pay as you can registration fee model with 90% of cost underwritten by the Colorado Soccer Foundation

## **Skills Training**

- Community informed programming in the summer for ages 4–12 year-olds
- 50% increase in participation year of year
- Cost per session is \$2.50 or pay-as-you-can model


Average of 90 youth per session 3x a week





### **Leagues and Tournaments**


- Community low-cost leagues for friendly competition

## **Our Playbook**


CSF has created a sustainable revenue model with earned and contributed income.
